

2018 City Council Activity Report

City of Albion, Nebraska

A monthly summary of notable policy and legislative action taken the Albion City Council during the year 2018.

Notable 2018 Operations Activities for the City of Albion:

- Another successful city wide clean up held in May.
- City initiated implemented first phase of DTR Plan Façade Improvement Program with \$350,000 grant from State of Nebraska Department of Economic Development.
- Executed an agreement with Boone County for siting of new production well on county property west of existing well and constructed test well at the site.
- JEO Consulting Group prepared plans and specs for new production well, currently out for bid.
 Bids to be opened January 30, 2019.
- Water Dept reported progress in radio-read meter change-out program 739 of 896 (82%) meters converted since the program began in 2009. This is up from 667 (74%) last year.
- Fire Hydrant near Hospital replaced.
- Sale Barn Road Water main replacement/upgrade project completed by Rutjen's Construction.
- Security fencing at the tower and well site installed as part of a security grant from DHHS.
- Security cameras installed at various city facilities including the Water tower/well site, City Hall, Fire Hall, Tree Burn Site, and the Sewer plant.
- Annual Sewer maintenance program completed including root treatment.
- Replaced half the Ultra Violet lamp kits for sewer treatment plant.
- Purchased new nozzles for sewer jet truck to improve root removal.
- Repaired pump motor on sewer jet truck.
- Purchased property near sewer treatment plant for guaranteed sludge application, potential future plant expansion, and potential future relocation of compost and burn sites for better access control.
- Midlands Contracting and Gehring Construction completed Fairview Phase II Strom Sewer and Paving Improvement Project in October (under budget by \$275,000).
- Street Maintenance Program Activity completed in 2018 included crack sealing and spot concrete repair of 8th St near Prairie St; 9th and Church St; Fairview St near Hospital; 9th and Clark St; 11th and Fairview St; 9th and Market St; &, 3rd and Walnut St.
- Purchased new aggregate spreader for salt/sand during winter months.
- Sold surplus property: Hustler Super Z Mower 72" Deck.
- Police Dept purchased 2017 Dodge Charger from Kansas Highway Patrol.
- Fire Department purchased new ambulance, had dirtwork completed on back side of fire station, and had concrete lot cracks sealed at same time Streets were done.
- Fire Department hosting group training for multiple departments.
- Fire Department held a water rescue training for department members and pool staff at the Albion Family Aquatic Center.
- The City of Albion, Boone County Area Foundation, Boone County Commissioner, Boone County Ag Society, and the Economic Development Groups partnership successfully raised funds for a looped trail system linking the Fuller Park and Boone County Fairgrounds.
- B&S Concrete of Petersburg, NE completed the Recreational Trail Project in October (under budget \$21,000).
- West ball fields at the Sports Complex were improved with Ag Lime surfacing.
- Installed WiFi access at the Sports Complex.
- Campground expansion have been added to the Capital Improvement Plan Project list for 2019.
- Library partnered with the Albion Chamber to host a Taste of Albion event.
- Library installed landscaping rock and plants around perimeter of Library.
- 58 Building Permits were issued in 2018 at an estimated total value of \$6,029,400.
