REGULAR MEETING – PUBLIC HEARING

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 11, 2020

A Regular Meeting of the Albion City Council of the City of Albion, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:30 p.m. on February 11, 2020 at Albion City Hall, 420 West Market St., Albion, NE. Present were: Mayor James C. Jarecki, Council Members Marcus Johnson, Jon Porter, Chris Kohtz, and Walt Hoefer. City staff present were: City Administrator Andrew Devine, Deputy City Clerk Sharon Ketteler, Water Commissioner Ron Morearty, City Attorney Darren Wright, and Officer Joe Predmore. Notice of this meeting along with the agenda was simultaneously given in advance to all members of the Board. Notice of this meeting was given in advance by publication, a designated method for giving notice; a copy of proof of publication is attached to these minutes. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The meeting was recorded using an audio recording device and such recording is available for inspection at the office of the City Clerk.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Jarecki informed the public about the location of the current copy of the Open Meetings Act posted in the Council Chambers. The Mayor stated that procedures have changed on One & Six Year Street Improvement Plan. Comments will be received tonight, however, we won't adopt a resolution until further research has been done on necessary procedure of the public hearing.

3. OPEN PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE CITY OF ALBION 2020 ONE & SIX YEAR STREET IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Mayor Jarecki opened the public hearing at 7:35 p.m. The Mayor sought public input. Testimony was given by two citizens proclaiming necessary repairs needed for their alleys. Mayor Jarecki stated that the hearing would remain open throughout the meeting and additional public input would continue to be received.

At 7:50 p.m. Mayor Jarecki announced there would be a recess to the public hearing until the March city council meeting.

 OF THE SAME – RIDING MOWER & TRACTOR

Council Members reviewed the resolution. Councilman Hoefer stated there used to be a belly mower with the International tractor, and questioned if it would be included with the sale of the tractor. Clerk Devine stated it will be included if it can be located. Councilman Johnson made a motion to introduce and adopt Resolution 102(20), second by Porter. Vote: Yeas; Kohtz, Johnson, Porter, Hoefer. Nays; None.

5. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT TO THE CITY COUNCIL REGARDING THE STATUS OF VARIOUS CITY DEPARTMENTS, CITY ACTIVITIES, AND CITY FINANCIAL REPORTS

Administrator Devine had previously provided a report for council review. Devine added there was an update on the ACE distribution check to the City of Albion showing the amount to be closer to \$6,000 rather than the \$4,000 - \$5,000 written in the report. The money should be received next month.

Devine met with an appraiser for the recreational property transfer. It was discovered that Nebraska Game and Parks requires a yellow book appraisal, which he could not do. Mr. Devine has requested a list of appraisers that can do a yellow book appraisal.

Devine also added that the City recently purchased 600 tons of crushed asphalt millings to be used at the Sports Complex and on alleys. **No action taken.**
